Aquabox responds to forest fires in Nepal

Serious forest fires have been causing further misery in Nepal and hampering the recovery from the recent earthquakes. Officials have said that as much as 1.3 million hectares of forest cover in Nepal were destroyed by wild fires in the space of a fortnight.

Some villages have been totally decimated by fires, with houses and shelter completely destroyed. Tragically at least 18 people have been killed and the lives of thousands of people have been seriously disrupted, leaving them in need of immediate humanitarian aid.

Working in conjunction with our partner Christian African Relief Trust (CART), 25 Aquabox Community Filters were shipped from the depot on 13th May destined for Cameroon.

Cameroon is currently experiencing a serious water crisis and, as is often the case, the first victims of any crisis are children. Many schools are operating without water and children use water from very unsafe sources such as streams, wells and rivers for drinking and cleaning. The deployment of Aquabox Community Filters will go a long way to reduce water-borne diseases and illness, and of course to greatly improve levels of attendance at school.
