Rotary GB&I Foundation Communiqué

We are dismayed at the way that support to both the Annual Fund and End Polio Now fund have dropped so far this Rotary year. Our Coordinator group had a conversation about this, during which we were told that the contributions in the rest of the world are still holding up.

Why have donations dropped so low in Rotary GB&I?

Endowment/Major Gift Adviser Mike Hodge, was quick to suggest the answer – the rest of the world take personal ownership of The Rotary Foundation by making individual contributions. In our Regions, many clubs raise cash during the year through fund-raising events and activities, and then deduct a percentage for our charity. This usually works well, but not during the present epidemic!

My Club President cannot understand why the most of our members have cancelled their monthly payments for meals that we are no longer having. Her reasoning (and I agree with her, of course) is that as we aren't raising money at events and not having meals at the meetings, why not contribute part of these savings to The Rotary Foundation?

Touching Little Hearts Global Grant project

Every year over 200,000 children in India are born with Congenital Heart defects. These children cannot survive without corrective heart surgery. Most parents from impoverished families simply cannot afford this. As a surgeon from Mumbai, I am aware of how devasting it can be to these families.



In 2018, when I visited the Rotary Club of Bombay West Coast in Mumbai, PDG Dr Bal introduced me to the project and asked the Rotary Club of Walsall to be their International partner. The project touched my heart and was the beginning of our Global Grant project.

Under the leadership of PDG Dr Bal and with the combined efforts of our clubs and districts the \$69,500 project was launched in August 2019 to treat 50 children.

Part of the grant was to assist in conducting rural camps to detect heart defects in children. They would go on to be operated in Kokilaben Ambani Hospital in Mumbai. It will also assist in training cardiac surgeons so that they can benefit many more children.

When I revisited Mumbai in 2019 to witness the project in action, I was extremely happy to see tiny babies survive this major operation, and the smiles of the parents who expressed their profound gratitude to Rotary. So far, fifty surgeries have been performed. Due to stringent stewardship, additional income due to bank interest and a favourable exchange rate, fifteen more surgeries have been performed, exceeding original target of fifty.

This project is an excellent example of 'Rotary at its best'.

Project leader Simon Kalson writes: "The funds raised for END POLIO NOW this year are an amazing £6,552.83. Each pack of 10 cards sold at £4.50 inclusive of P&P and the profit per pack was £2.50, nearly 56% of the sale



price. With the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation double matching the donation to EPN is £7.50 per pack. A Club buying just 20 packs at £90.00 will see their End Polio Now account credited with £50.00, converted to US Dollars at the going rate."
