So Where does the Money Go

- All your Club funds generally are sent to Rotary Foundation in UK - RFUK - and then they send them to Rotary Foundation Headquarters in Evaston USA
- Funds from Sustaining Members generally go the same route
- This money is invested based on a 3-year cycle
 - THEN.....

So Where does the Money Go

- 47.5% of the funds are returned to us at District 1220
- 47.5% of the funds remain with Foundation and are used in the World Fund
- 5% is used for the Administration of the Rotary Foundation

So Where does the Money Go

- Based on the 3 year cycle, in Rotary Year 2025/26 the funds returned to District 1220 were based on our contributions in 2022/23
- This gave us a fund for 2025/26 of
\$38,992.06
- District 1220 follow the requirement of Rotary Foundation that 50% of the District Funds are used for District Grants, so in 2025/26 this was
\$19,946.00

So Where does the Money Go

- So how was this \$19,946 “spent”
- Well it was not spent by District – it was spent by you the Clubs
- Actually the Rotary Clubs that made application for District Grant Funds
- Thirteen Clubs made applications for District Grants

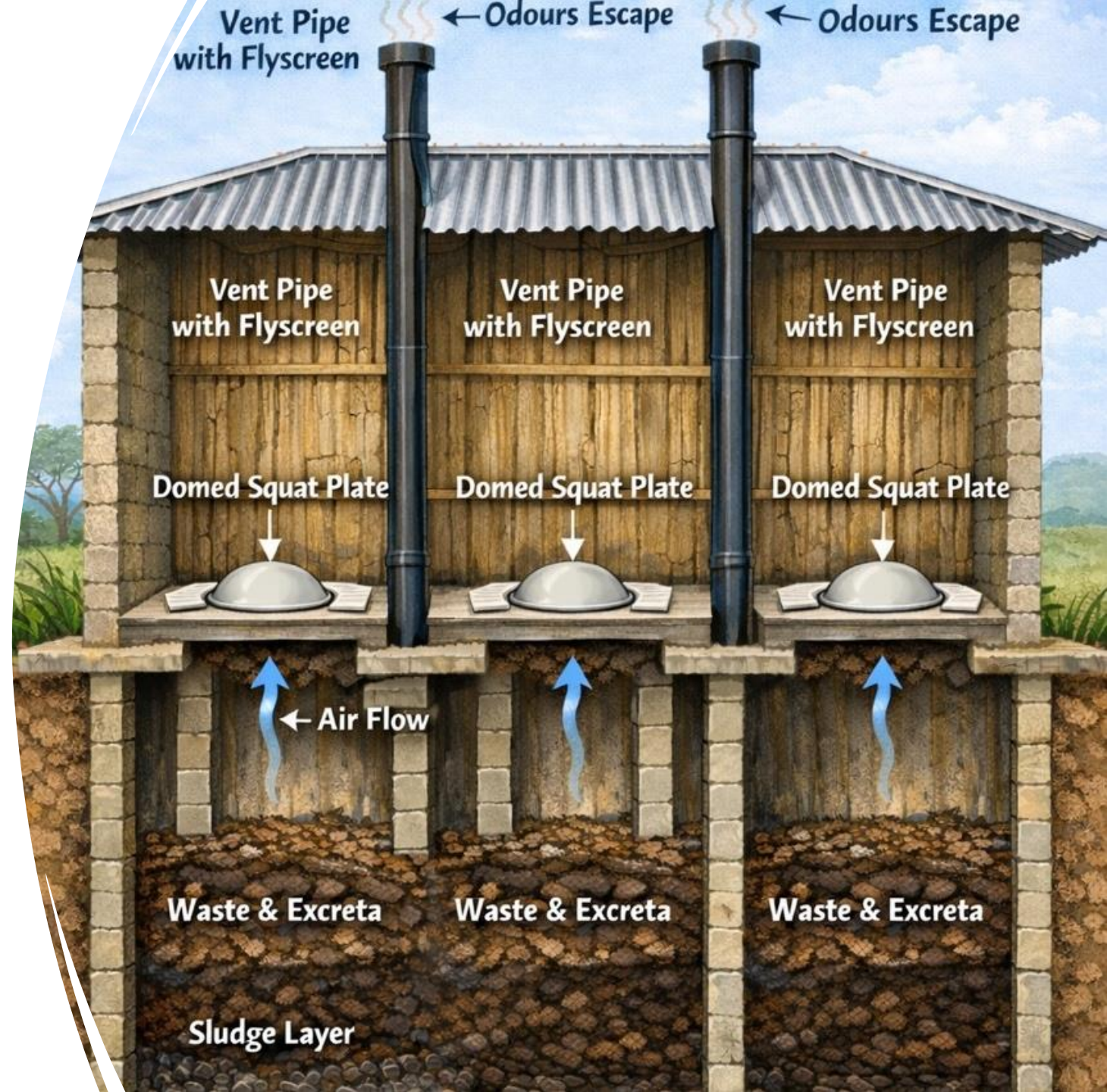

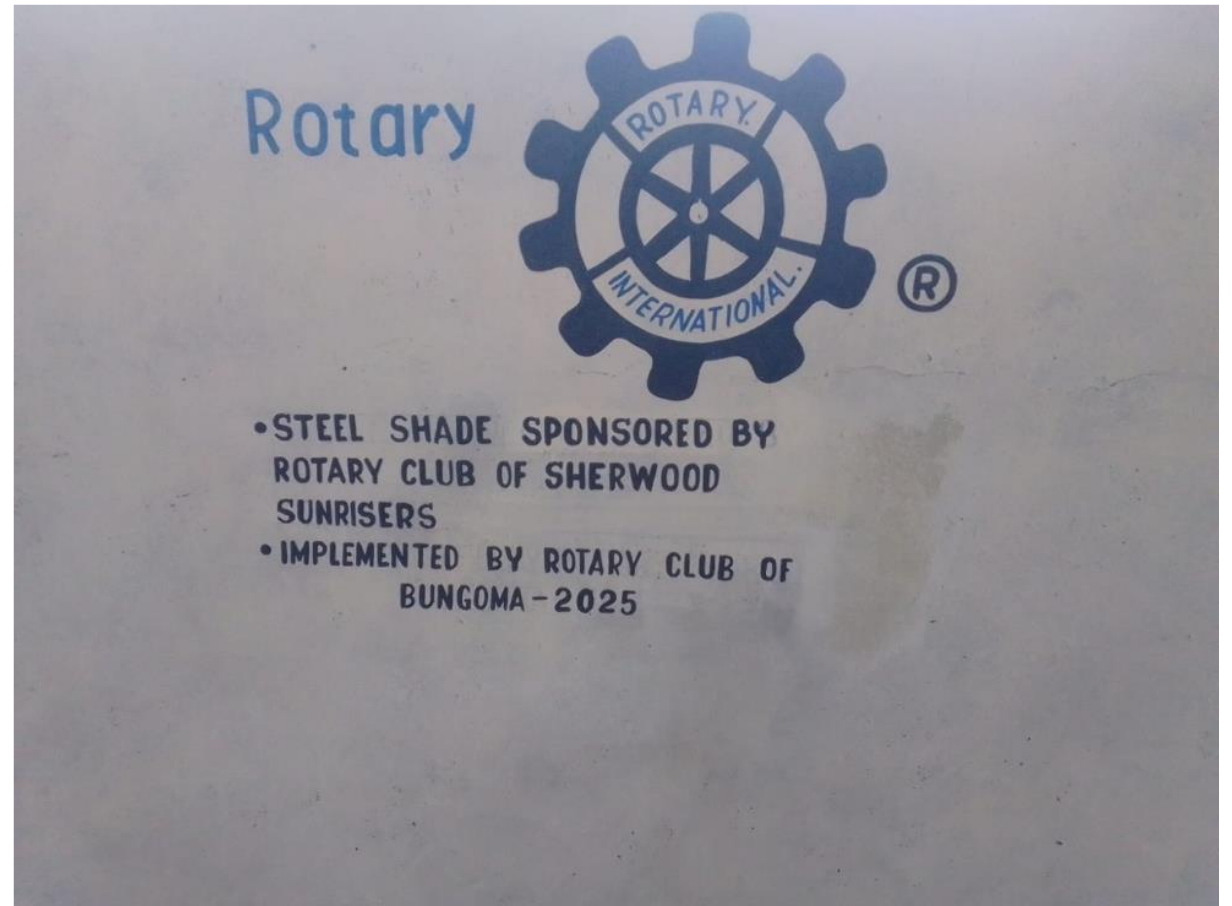
Retford

A need was identified in Market Rasen for additional support for parents of babies and young Children, so the Weigh, stay and play group was formed

Age-appropriate toys are now required, this project will help 'kit out' to ensure it is fit-for-purpose.

DISTRICT GRANTS 2026/27

- We are now preparing for the 2026/27 year
- We will have in the order of £13,972.00 - dependant on exchange rates
- We will still be leaving Maximum District Grant at £1,500.00 but depending on how many clubs apply for a Grant and the overall value of requests it will almost certainly less than this figure for each application.
- So, when doing your sums perhaps assume a District Grant of between £750.00 and £1,000.00

DISTRICT GRANTS 2026/27

- The Initial Information and documents to apply for a District Grant in 2026/27 will be issued in early May and the deadline for applications will be 31st July 2026
- **PLEASE** can you ensure, even if you are not looking for a District Grant, that your club has a Foundation Officer registered on Rotary View

We were advised that \$51,886.83 of the remaining unallocated if not used by District for Global Grants it would be returned to the World Fund (due to “5 year Rule”) and lost to District 1220

During this 2025 - 26 year we have been able to allocate DDF funds

- We firstly had to allocate the 2025-26 fund, before we could start using to 2020-21 funds
- We have then been able to contribute to Global Grants and End Polio Now
- I can now show you how this was done

Washroom Toilets in Cambodia

- This Grant was supported by Rotary Club of Wollaton Park who donated \$10,000.00
- From our DDF fund we allocated \$10,000.00 to match their funding.
- In total the Grant was for \$145,600.00
- \$41,600.00 contributed by World Fund,
- \$42,000.00 from three other Districts and
- \$42,000.00 from four other clubs around the world

Family Health Days in South Africa

- From our DDF fund we allocated \$3,000.00.
- In total the Grant was for \$57,706.00
- \$23,283.00 contributed by World Fund
- \$26,104.00 from ten other Districts and
- \$5,319.00 from three other clubs around the world

Uplifting Livelihoods in Rural Zimbabwe

- This Grant was commenced by Rotary Club of Derby Daybreak, following a presentation at D1220 Club Council
- It was supported by Rotary Club of Sheffield Vulcan
- From our DDF fund we allocated \$22,500.00
- In total the Grant was for \$43,461.00
- \$18,000.00 contributed by World Fund

Canolfan Elfed Soft play and sensory garden

- This Grant was commenced by Rotary Club of Carmarthen Tywi.
- It was supported by six districts and 9 clubs
- From our DDF fund we allocated \$2,500.00
- In total the Grant was for \$77,104.00
- \$30,400.00 contributed by World Fund

**Further Education provision in the Sri Sai
Vidyarthi High School**

- This Grant was commenced by Rotary Club of Amber Valley who donated \$4,163.00
- From our DDF fund we allocated \$19,500.00,
- In total the Grant was for \$39,263.00
- \$15,600.00 contributed by World Fund

Other donations from our DDF

- In addition to the Global Grants you have just seen we also were able to contribute
- \$10,000.00 to End Polio Now campaign
- \$1,000.00 to the Hurricane Melissa Disaster Response Fund
- It has also been agreed at District Executive that the remaining \$2,882.89 of 20-21 DDF will be transferred to End Polio Now
